Special Smiles is the dental health discipline of Special Olympics Healthy Athletes® that provides athletes with intellectual disabilities the opportunity to take charge of their oral health.

Special Smiles provides comprehensive oral health care information, offers free dental screenings and instructions on correct brushing and flossing techniques to Special Olympics athletes. This also includes issuing preventative supplies, like toothpaste, toothbrushes and fluoride varnish.

Importance and Impact:

Special Smiles screenings indicate a large percentage of Special Olympics athletes are unaware of the condition of their oral health.

Out of SONJ athletes screened:

- 45.6% have signs of gingivitis
- **16.8%** have missing teeth
- 10.2% have untreated tooth decay
- **6.9%** have mouth pain
- 4.6% are in need of urgent care

Criteria for Clinical Directors:

Individuals interested in acting as a Clinical Director for Special Smiles events should have the following qualifications and skills:

- Licensed Dentist or Dental Hygienist
- Ability to work with local program to determine event opportunities and evaluate programming
- Recruit and train volunteer health professionals
- Obtain equipment, supplies, and athlete giveaways
- Set up and supervise Healthy Athletes venue
- Collect and report data

Purpose of the Screening:

Special Smiles is an event designed to:

- Increase access to dental care for Special Olympics athletes, as well as people with intellectual disabilities
- Raise dental professionals' awareness of the oral health concerns of people with special needs, including difficulties involved in accessing care
- Develop a body of knowledge about the oral health care needs of children and adults with disabilities
