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Special Olympics New Jersey Snow Bowl Flag Football Tournament Hosted by the NY Giants at Metlife Stadium

What: The **17th annual <u>Snow Bowl</u>** flag football tournament hosted by the <u>New York</u> <u>Football Giants</u> to benefit thousands of <u>Special Olympics New Jersey</u> athletes.

Who: Approximately **1,500 individual fundraisers** on **110 teams** will take the field at MetLife Stadium to compete for a championship and raise money for Special Olympics New Jersey.

When/Where: <u>Snow Bowl</u> will take place on the field at MetLife Stadium from **Friday**, **March 3** to **Sunday**, **March 5.** Games begin at 9:00 a.m. on Friday and run through midafternoon on Sunday.

Media Hours: Media are invited to cover the Snow Bowl throughout the weekend and will need to check-in to receive a credential to access the coaches club and field. Check-in will be just inside the Bud Light gate entrance and parking will be available in adjacent Lot A with overflow parking in lot H.

More Info: To compete, teams of up to 15 must raise a minimum of \$2,400 and are entitled to a minimum of three 6-on-6 light-touch flag football games on the turf in the MetLife Stadium. Teams choose to compete in either the law enforcement/firefighter, recreation, competitive, 40 & older, Unified recreation, or coed divisions.

The New York Giants Legacy Museum and Giants locker room will be open, while former and current New York Giants are expected to make appearances.
